- Create Great British Energy to drive investment in clean homegrown energy production
- Maintain strategic reserve of gas power stations
- Will reward clean energy developers with a British Jobs Bonus allocating up to £500m per year from 2026 to incentivise firms offering good jobs, terms and conditions, build their manufacturing supply chains in industrial heartlands, coastal areas and energy communities
- Warm Homes Plan to offer grants and low interest loans to support investment in insulation and other improvements such as solar panels, batteries and low carbon heating to cut bills
- Will work with private sector including banks and building societies to provide further private finance to accelerate home upgrades and low carbon heating
- Will ensure homes in the private rented sector meet MEES by 2030
- Nobody will be forced to rip out their boiler as a result of Labour's plans
- Create a new Clean Power Alliance bringing together a coalition of countries at the cutting edge of climate action
- Extend Awaab's Law to the private rented sector

- Will invest £6 billion in energy efficiency over the next three years to make around a million homes warmer.
- Will fund an energy efficiency voucher scheme, open to every household in England, to support the installation of energy efficiency measures and solar panels, helping families lower their bills
- No new green levies or charges while accelerating the rollout of renewables
- Annual licensing rounds for oil and gas production from the North Sea to provide energy to homes and businesses
- Will back up renewables and prevent the prospect of blackouts with new gas power stations
- Invest £1.lbn into Green
 Industries Growth Accelerator to support British manufacturing capabilities, boost supply chains and ensure our energy transition is made in Britain
- Implement a new import carbon pricing mechanism by 2027
- A vote in the next Parliament on the next stage of our pathway to Net Zero with adoption of any new target accompanied by proper consideration of plans and policies required
- Reform Climate Change
 Committee mandate so it has to consider cost to households and UK energy security in its future advice
- Introduce more efficient local markets for electricity
- Give households choice of smart energy tariffs

- Net Zero by 2045
- Would create a 10-year emergency upgrade programme to ensure all new homes are zero carbon
- Free insulation and heat pumps for those on low incomes
- Introducing a new subsidised Energy-Saving Homes scheme, with pilots to find the most effective combination of tax incentives, loans and grants, together with advice and support.
- Immediately requiring all new homes and non-domestic buildings to be built to a zero-carbon standard, including being fitted with solar panels, and progressively increasing standards as technology improves
- Reintroducing requirements for landlords to upgrade the energy efficiency of their properties to EPC C or above by 2028

- Establish a youth guarantee of access to training, an apprenticeship or support to find work for all 18-21-year-olds
- Put employers at the heart of the skills system
- Bring forward a comprehensive strategy for post-16 education
- Establish Skills England to bring together business, training providers and unions with national and local government to ensure we have the highly trained workforce needed to deliver the Industrial Strategy
- Devolve adult skills funding to Combined Authorities; Skills England will co-ordinate between local areas to ensure everyone can access opportunities
- Transform FE colleges into Technical Excellence Colleges that work with businesses, trade unions and local government to provide young people with better job opportunities and the high trained workforce that local economies need
- Reform Apprenticeships Levy and create a Growth and Skills Levy with Skills England consulting on eligible courses to ensure qualifications offer value for money

- Fund 100,000 high-quality apprenticeships
- Transform 16-19 education by introducing the Advanced British Standard enabling young people to receive a broader education and removing the artificial divide between academic and technical learning
- Deliver the Lifelong Learning Entitlement giving adults the support they need to train, retrain and upskill flexibly throughout their working lives
- From the 2025 academic year, adults will be able to apply for loans to cover new qualifications.
- Will also continue to expand adult skills programmes, such as Skills Bootcamps which meet skills shortages

- The construction sector would be put on a sustainable footing including through investment in skills, training and new technologies
- Fix the skills and recruitment crisis by investing in education and training, including increasing the availability of apprenticeships and career advice for young people
- Replacing the broken apprenticeship levy with a broader and more flexible skills and training levy
- Boosting the take-up of apprenticeships, including by guaranteeing they are paid at least the National Minimum Wage by scrapping the lower apprentice rate
- Create new Lifelong Skills Grants, giving all adults £5,000 to spend on education and training throughout their lives, and aim to increase them to £10,000 in the future when the public finances allow
- Developing National Colleges as national centres of expertise for key sectors, such as renewable energy, to deliver the high-level vocational skills that businesses need
- Review further education funding, including the option of exempting colleges from VAT

- Will reform the points-based immigration system so that it is fair and properly managed, with appropriate restrictions on visas, and by linking immigration and skills policy
- Create a partnership between business and trade unions by implementing 'Labour's Plan to make Work Pay: Delivering a New Deal for Working People' in full, with legislation introduced within 100 days
- Introducing basic rights from day one (sick leave) and protection from unfair dismissal
- Create a Single Enforcement Body to ensure employment rights are upheld
- Remove age bands from living wage and change remit of Low Pay Commission to account for cost of living

- Take another 2p off employee NI so it will be 6% by April 2027
- Abolish the main rate of selfemployed NI entirely by the end of the Parliament
- Legal cap in migration so numbers fall every year but still bring in skills business need
- Rate of income tax will not be raised
- Maintain National Living Wage at 2/3 of median earnings
- End retrospective tax changes such as the loan charge brought in by the Conservatives, and review the Government's offpayroll working IR35 reforms to ensure self-employed people are treated fairly

- Shifting the burden of proof in employment tribunals regarding employment status from individual to employer
- Reform Statutory Sick Pay so it is available to more people, is aligned with the NWM, payments are available from Day 1, not 4 and supporting SMEs with Statutory Sick Pay costs
- Replace the Conservatives' arbitrary salary threshold with a more flexible merit-based system for work visas, with the relevant department working with employers in each sector to address specific needs as part of a long-term workforce strategy that also focuses on education and training to address skills gaps from within the UK
